We are glad to present the 38th annual report of our school. All activities at Christ Central School are thoughtfully planned with a clear vision: to shape leaders who are intellectually competent, spiritually mature, morally upright, psychologically integrated physically healthy and socially acceptable who will champion the cause of justice, love, truth and peace and who are ever open to further growth.

It’s a moment of pride and a sense of achievement to share with you all some of the glorious tasks achieved during the academic year.

## **Staff and student position**

This school has a total strength of 1677 students and the staff community consist of 77 teachers and 36 non-teaching staff. 10 new teachers joined Christ family this year.

## **1. Staff orientation programmes**

A teacher who loves learning earns the right and the ability to help others learn. Teacher training programmes help them to better connect with, manage and teach their students in a manner which ensures that all students are learning and benefitting.

- A training program for teachers was conducted on 25th May on National Curriculum Framework and Holistic Progress Card which was led by Dr. Rajan Joseph K, Principal, Matha Central School, Alappuzha.
- A CBSE training on Life Skills was held on 28th May 2024. It was led by Mr. Radhakrishnan and Dr. Reveendran Nair, CBSE master trainers.
- An orientation class was organised by Ratna Sagar Publishers on 30th May 2024. Mr Prasad Prasad led the session on STEAM Education and multidisciplinary subject integrated learning.
- A training session on NEP was conducted for the teachers of kindergarten section by Password Publication. The session was taken by Ms.Catherine Steffie Benstein.

We prepare a strategic plan for the academic year. The main thrust areas of the plan are academic excellence, discipline, communication and character formation. We have staff meetings every month to evaluate our activities and to make the necessary changes and corrections.

Our faculty also attended various training programmes and workshops which help them to be proficient in their subject and exceptionally resourceful.

## **2. Orientation Class for Students**

The orientation classes for students are conducted to enlighten them on topics of current relevance.

- A seminar was conducted for the students of class XI on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2024 on First Aid. It was led by Dr Rony Thomas and Dr Durgachit and their team from Pushpagiri Medical College.

### **3. Academic excellence**

“The best students are not those who are the most intelligent, they are the one who take the advantage of their God gifted talents and work hard to surge ahead of all their classmates”. I am immensely proud to congratulate all the toppers and centum scorers of SSCE and SSE, for surging ahead and being the champions.

A look at the result of Board Exams held in 2024.

In the CBSE class XII exam, 12 students secured A1 in all the subjects. 44 students got above 90%, 88 students passed with distinction and 30 students got first class. Josh Mammen Jacob and Juwel Elza Varghese are the school toppers from Science and Commerce stream respectively. I am very proud to add that Juwel Elza Varghese is the Sahodaya Pathanamthitta District Topper in the SSE 2024.

7 students got A1 in all subjects in the SSE 2024. 35 students got distinction and 34 students passed with first class. Sera Anna Soney was the school topper.

### **4. Re-opening Ceremony**

On 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024, Christ Central School was once again full of life and vigour with the advent of students after the 2 months summer vacation. The school re-opened for classes II to X and XII on the day. Rev Fr. Dr Philip Payyampillil, CEO Pushpagiri Medical College Thiruvalla was the chief guest of the day.

Our Tiny Tots of kindergarten and standard I were welcomed to their second home on 6<sup>th</sup> June 2024. The chief guest of the day was Rev Fr Cherian Kakkuzhy, Vicar of St. Antony’s Church Muthoor.

Classes for the Std. XI started on 10<sup>th</sup> June 2024.

### **5. Examination System**

Christ Central School caters to the intellectual, physical, psychological, spiritual and aesthetic development of the students. Various scholastic activities and competitions are held in the school to reinforce the strength of academics and knowledge in students. Monthly unit tests, mid-term examinations, semester examinations, assignments, projects, work experiences and class tests help the

students remain in competitive rhythm. This helps them to avoid the rote learning and help them to develop their creativity, critical thinking and analysis.

The open house is organised after all assessments and exams to provide parents a feedback on the academic performance of their children supervised by teachers.

Our teachers are keen to conduct remedial classes for the slow learners and the other students who are interested after the school hours. This help the children in boosting confidence by addressing the root cause of their struggles and help them regain their confidence.

## **6. Holistic Progress Card**

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 recommends Holistic Progress Card which is a 360-degree, multidimensional report of progress, that reflects in detail the progress as well as the uniqueness of each learner in the cognitive, affective, socio-emotional and psychomotor domains. It is a proud initiative of our school to introduce Holistic Progress Card for the assessment of the students from KG to Std III.

## **7. Counselling**

Our school has a permanent faculty in counselling. School Counsellor works to enable the students for their holistic development through identifying their inner strength. The students are empowered with life skills needed to face the challenges they are facing in the present scenario.

We also have a special educator to help us to take care of academically weak students.

## **Celebrations and Events**

A number of celebrations and events were organised throughout the year to ensure better personality development among students as we believe that each child is unique and possesses inherent potentials.

### **1. World Environment Day**

As part of our Environment Day celebrations, seed pens were distributed, saplings were planted in the school premises and posters were displayed on 5<sup>th</sup> June 2024. A few competitions were conducted by the science department in connection with

our Environment Day celebrations like essay writing, identification of the leaf of plants, poster making and model making with eco-friendly materials.

Various programmes were conducted on 19<sup>th</sup> June 2024 to give the students awareness about the conservation of our environment.

The Environment Day celebration of KG section was held on 7<sup>th</sup> June 2024. A sapling was planted and numerous other programmes were also conducted.
