In view of current COVID-19 pandemic which has most severely affected the normal functioning of schools in the country, however, the school is pursuing to provide extension of affiliation so as to avoid any difficulty for the purpose of admission /registration/ clearing NA/renewal of various safety certificates from appropriate state authorities.

Therefore, the competent authority of the Board after due consideration has accorded approval for extension of Affiliation based on details/data submitted by school in online application for a further period of 5 years subject to fulfillment of following conditions:

- The school will follow the RTE Act, 2009 and instructions issued thereon by the CBSE/Respective State /UT Govt. from time to time.
- The School is required to apply on time for further extension of affiliation along with the requisite fee and other documents as per Rule 10.3 of Affiliation Bye Laws, 2018.
- The school will also abide by the conditions prescribed, if any, by the State Government concerned as mentioned in certificate as per appendix III issued by District Education Officer (DEO), Equivalent Officer.
- The school should ensure the strong governance and management of its activities in way of comprehensive and quantifiable planning in way of curriculum planning, infrastructure, resources, physical education, staff development and other co-curricular areas.
- The school should go through the provision of **Affiliation and Examination Bye Laws and keep a copy thereof** for reference purpose and also advised to visit CBSE website i.e. <http://cbseacademic.nic.in/> & <http://cbse.nic.in/> for updates. The School is expected to see all circulars on these CBSE websites regularly.
- The school will strictly adhere to all rules regarding safety of students including Fire fighting and Transportation, etc. Further, school will provide adequate facilities for potable drinking water and clean healthy and hygienic toilets with washing facilities for boys and girls separately in proportion to the number of students. The school will ensure that Fire, Building, health and sanitation and safe drinking water certificates are renewed from time to time, as per norms.
- Admission to the school** is to be restricted as per relevant rules of Examination Bye-laws and rule 2.4.5, 2.6.5, 7.1, 7.2, 8.4.2, 8.4.10 & other relevant rules of Affiliation Bye laws.
- The school is required to follow rule No.2.4.7 and 2.4.8 of Affiliation Bye Laws regarding Books and Quality of Education.
- The number of sections may be restricted as per the Appendix V of the Affiliation Bye-Laws of the Board. For increase in number of sections, the School shall apply online to the Board as per rule 15.7 of Affiliation Bye laws.
- The school shall be solely responsible for any legal consequences arising out of the use of school name/logo/society/trust or any other identity related to running of school affiliated to CBSE. The school shall also be liable to bear all legal charges incurred by the Board, if any, arising out of these circumstances.
- The school must strive to promote conservation of environment on their campus through rain water harvesting, segregation of waste at source, recycling of organic waste, proper disposal of waste including electronic waste, use of energy saving and energy efficient electrical equipment, greening of campus, use of solar energy, education and awareness amongst children on environment conservation and cleanliness etc.
- The school shall submit their information through Online Affiliated School Information System (OASIS) as per details given in circular no. Affiliation-06/2018 dated 24.04.2018. Link for OASIS is available on board's website [www.cbse.nic.in](http://www.cbse.nic.in)
- The optimum Section teacher ratio of 1:1.5 as well as student teacher ratio of 30:1 is to be maintained to teach various subjects and school shall appoint qualified and trained teaching staff on regular basis as per provisions of Affiliation Bye Laws of the Board.
- Every affiliated school shall sponsor regularly its bonafide and eligible students in Board's Class X and Class XII examinations from the year mentioned while granting affiliation/up-gradation regularly without break or inform with reasons thereof in writing well in time about the non-sponsoring of the candidates.
- Running of coaching institutions in the school premises in the pretext of providing coaching to the students for various examinations is not permitted by the Board. Strict action would be taken on defaulters.
- The Manager and the Principal of the school shall be jointly responsible for the authenticity of the online/offline documents/ information/data submitted by the School to the Board.
- Apart from rules to be adhered to by the school as mentioned above for drawing specific attention of the school authorities, the school authorities are required to acquaint themselves with all the rules contained in Affiliation & Examination Bye-laws and circulars/guidelines/notification issued by the Board from time to time. Any laxity in following rules/instructions of the Board will lead to action against school as per clause 12 of Affiliation Bye-law-2018.
- The genuineness of information / documents / data submitted shall be of school and in case, if found otherwise the school shall invite action as per Affiliation Bye laws-2018.
- The school shall be responsible for submission of any pending compliance, reply of show cause/legal notice/ complaint and for submission of date/information sought by the Board. The extension of 05 years shall be from the date of cessation of previous validity of extension of affiliation.

- The extension of affiliation is being granted as one time measure. However, the cases where the Show Cause Notice was communicated or grievance / legal cases are pending against the school, the Board will take appropriate decision in this matter.



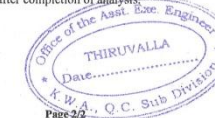

These capacity building programmes served as valuable eye-openers, enhancing the skills and knowledge of our teachers.

## **WEBINARS**

Throughout this year, several training programmes were seamlessly conducted online by various agencies. These webinars, specifically designed for teacher training, empowered educators to broaden and enhance their teaching methods and interpersonal skills with students. Both the Principal and teachers actively participated in a series of webinars organized by COE Trivandrum, Bharat Sahodaya and NCERT contributing to their professional development and enriching the overall learning experience at our institution.

## **BOARD EXAM RESULTS**

Christ Central School has maintained its tradition of achieving remarkable results in both SSE and SSCE examinations held in March 2022. Of the 190 class XII students, 7 secured A1 in all subjects, 87 achieved a score of 75% and above, and 58 students earned first class. Kumari Amritha Sankar emerged as the topper in the Science stream, while Kumari Rose Thomas attained the highest score in the Commerce stream.

In the class X examination, out of 149 students, 2 achieved A1 in all subjects, 26 scored 90% and above, 96 secured distinction, and 47 achieved First Class. Kumari Aathira Mary Jacob secured the highest score.



## **SCHOOL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE**

The School Management Committee plays a pivotal role in steering the strategic direction of the school, fostering collaboration among stakeholders, and ensuring the delivery of quality education that meets the needs of students and the broader community. Through its collective efforts, the SMC contributes to the continuous improvement and excellence of the educational institution.

The School Management Committee met on 14<sup>th</sup> April as well as 6<sup>th</sup> October, 2023 to discuss and decide upon various initiatives aimed at enhancing the educational experience and overall development of students at our institution.

### **Major Decisions of SMC Meeting held on 14<sup>th</sup> April, 2023**

1. To start a new Stream in Science with Psychology for STD XI, in order to support the students who has difficulty in Mathematics but wish to pursue their higher studies in Science subjects.
2. To start the skill course in Information Technology for the students of Std 6,7 & 8 as per the new circular issued by the CBSE.
3. To recommend to the Management to buy a couple of new school buses for the smooth conveyance of the students.
4. To introduce training in more art forms to facilitate effective art education and to hire expert trainers for the same so that the students get to learn an item of their choice.
5. More emphasis should be given to training in athletics and other sport events.
6. In-house training of teachers should focus on the relevant topics helpful to the effective implementation of NEP.
7. To provide the students with maximum exposure to various competitions, competitive exams, Olympiads and career orientation programmes to make them ready to find a course and career of their choice in future.
8. To take a concerted effort to improve the performance of students in Mathematics.
9. To conduct health check - up of all students in association with any of the hospitals nearby.
10. To recommend a minimum hike of 10% in the basic salary of the staff from the next academic session.

### **Major Decisions of SMC Meeting held on 6<sup>th</sup> October, 2023**

1. To host the literary events of Sahodaya Arts Fest (2 days) at our school in the last week of the month upon the request of the Sahodaya Executive Committee..
2. To recommend to the management to repair and tar the road inside the campus for the safe and smooth movement of students and vehicles.
3. To send the students to the Athletic Meets organized both by the Sahodaya and the District Management Association, so that the children would get an opportunity to participate in the State level Athletic Meet to be held later.
4. To initiate the activities to implement Holistic Report Card from the junior classes.
5. To shift the Annual Day Celebration of the school usually held in the last week of January to the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of December in order to help the senior students concentrate better on their studies as the Board Exams are scheduled from January 1, 2024.
6. To arrange an orientation programme for the students of Std 10 & 12 to help them back on track to fare well in the Board examinations.
7. To provide one to one remedial coaching for those students of Std X & XII who perform below their expected level.
8. To conduct an in - house training for all teachers on NEP to facilitate its effective implementation in our school.
